- Computer Systems
- Computers (Monitors, mice, keyboards & speakers)
- Computer parts (Cables, Cords, fans, power supplies, Hard drives for destruction, CPU, ram chips and boards)
- Laptops, notebooks, tablets and E-readers
- Printers, Fax Machines, Copiers and Scanners
- Wires and cables

NOT ACCEPTABLE for Recycling

Liquids of any kind (gas, paint or chemical); compressed cylinders (propane tanks, fire extinguishers); hazardous waste; household batteries (Alkaline); large appliances (stoves, washing machines, dryers or dishwashers); anything with Freon (fridges, AC units or water coolers); Fluorescent light fixtures or bulbs; thermostats; smoke detectors; glass of any kind; VHS tapes; DVDs or CDs; small appliances; household electronics; person hygiene devices; ink or toner; wooden speakers.

Recycling Scrap Metal is Important to Our Environment

Steel is the most recycled material on the planet, more than all other materials combined.

Two of every three pounds of steel in the US is manufactured using ferrous scrap.

About 60% of metals and alloys produced in the US are made from non-ferrous scrap.

It is estimated that scrap accounts for 40% of the world's raw material needs.

Every ton of new steel made from scrap steel conserves 2500 lbs. of iron ore, 1400 lbs. of coal and 120 lbs. of limestone.

As of the first quarter of 2015, the recycling industry has collected approximately 4 million switches, keeping 9,000 lbs. of mercury out of the environment.
